

WORSHIP NOTES

THE SEASON OF CHRISTMAS

You are probably familiar with the carol *The Twelve Days of Christmas.* While that carol isn't religious, its title does capture the fact that on Christmas Day the Christian Church begins a twelve day celebration.



Historically, the celebration of Christmas didn't begin until Christmas Eve. That was the night homes were decorated with trees and tinsel. (It is the secularization of Christmas and the desire to have a longer shopping season that has pushed the "beginning" of Christmas back into November.) Christmas Eve often consisted of a vigil, either at church or in the home, that was quiet and muted. Then, come Christmas Day, all Christians would gather in church as a joyous celebration began. Families would continue to worship (and, yes, give gifts) for twelve straight days. The celebration of Christmas would end with the Festival of the Epiphany, marking the appearance of the Wise Men.

THE FESTIVAL OF THE NATIVITY

Nativus is Latin for "birth." By the fourth century, the early Christian Church had set December 25th as the day to celebrate the birth of Christ. Along with Easter, it quickly became one of the major celebrations in the Church Year. It always included celebration of the Lord's Supper. This is seen in the word *Christmas*, which is simply short for "Christ's Mass."

CONFESSION OF FAITH

Excerpts from the Athanasian Creed

It is necessary for eternal salvation truly to believe that our Lord Jesus Christ also took on human flesh.

Now this is the true Christian faith:

We believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son, is both God and man.

He is God, eternally begotten from the nature of the Father, and he is man, born in time from the nature of his mother,

fully God, fully man, with rational soul and human flesh;

equal to the Father as to his deity,

less than the Father as to his humanity;

and though he is both God and man,

Christ is not two persons, but one,

one, not by changing the deity into flesh,

but by taking the humanity into God;

one, indeed, not by mixture of the natures,

but by unity in one person;

for just as the rational soul and flesh are one human being,

so God and man are one Christ.

He suffered for our salvation,

descended into hell,

rose the third day from the dead.

He ascended into heaven,

is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty,
